As we move into Term 4, we would like to highlight key programmes and information for you to note:

#### 1. P5 Learning Journey to the Indian Heritage Centre (IHC) (1, 2 and 8 October)

Cohort learning journeys extend our students' learning beyond the classrooms and learn how the diverse cultures have shaped Singapore's multicultural heritage. This learning journey to the Indian Heritage Centre will encourage our students to recognize contributions made to our arts and cultural heritage by the Indian community. Students will be provided with authentic learning experiences that will lead them to better appreciate the cultural diversity of our society.















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#### 2. Children's Day Celebrations (3 October)

Our TGPS Children's Day celebration, themed "We are CHAMPionS," is a vibrant reflection of our commitment to Character and Holistic development through Arts, Music, and Physical activitieS (CHAMPS). The day's activities will provide valuable opportunities to strengthen Teacher-Student and Student-Student Relationships, helping our students grow into well-rounded CHAMPionS.

#### 3. P2 Learning Journey - National Orchid Park (14 to 16 October)

The cohort learning journey to the National Orchid Gardens will allow our students to learn about the many types of orchids and about our national flower. In addition, the trail will enable students to recognize our common identity, as well as shared experiences and values that unite the people in Singapore.

#### 4. P4 Learning Journey to Forest Adventure (14 to 16 October)

A visit to Forest Adventure is more than just an exciting outing; it is a valuable educational experience that prepares our TG Stars for their upcoming P5 Camp Discov3r-mE next year.

Forest Adventure stands out as Singapore's premier rope course designed exclusively for children, offering an exciting and educational experience for young adventurers. This learning journey is designed to inspire and motivate, making it an unforgettable part of the school experience.
